INTRODUCTION



Congresswoman Kathy Manning

NC-06

Kathy Manning represents North Carolina's Sixth Congressional District which includes all of Guilford County and parts of Forsyth County. Kathy graduated from Harvard University and the University of Michigan Law School before moving to Greensboro, NC in 1987, where she and her husband raised their three children. After serving as a partner at a major law firm for 15 years, she left to start her own law firm. She then worked on access to early childhood education, college scholarships, workforce development, and economic development. Kathy is a member of the Education and Labor Committee and the Foreign Affairs Committee.



Dr. Bobbie Richardson

Following her exemplary education career, Dr. Richardson served on the Executive Committee for the NC Democratic Party. She was also a past chair of the Franklin County Democratic Party. Dr. Richardson was appointed to represent NC house district 7 in January 2013 and won election in November 2014. There she served as Secretary of the House Democratic Caucus and as House Democratic Caucus Whip. Following her tenure in the House, Dr. Richardson served as First Vice Chair of the North Carolina Democratic Party from 2019-2020 and was elected Chair on February 27, 2021, by members of the State Executive Committee (SEC). Dr. Richardson's election is historical as she is the first Black leader to hold the post in the state



Secretary Elizabeth Biser

Governor Roy Cooper named Elizabeth S. Biser as Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality in June 2021. She is the first woman confirmed as DEQ Secretary.

As DEQ Secretary, she oversees the state agency whose mission is to protect North Carolina's environment and natural resources. The organization has offices from the mountains to the coast and administers regulatory and public assistance programs aimed at protecting the quality of North Carolina's air, water and land, its coastal fisheries, and the public's health.



Paige Johnson

Paige Johnson serves as Chief Program Officer for Planned Parenthood South Atlantic (PPSAT), a title that encompasses the many roles she has held in her twenty-one-year tenure with the organization. Her job is to deliver on Planned Parenthood's mission, which includes overseeing patient services in 14 health centers throughout North Carolina, South Carolina, West Virginia, and Virginia, providing roughly 73,000 essential health care visits this year. Paige also leads PPSAT's award-winning education program, which provides sex education to more than 9,000 young people online and in person every year. and she continues to oversee advocacy, which is where she got her start with the organization.

Jane "Betty" Barnett

Betty is a retired high school math teacher, who served on the board of Democratic Women of Moore County in several offices, has been a charter member of the Climate Crisis Working Group of Moore County, and advocates for climate issues with the futures of her and all of our grandchildren and great- grandchildren as inspiration.

Christine "Tina" Ganis

Tina has been a psychologist since 1980 and holds degrees from Penn State and NCSU. She is married and has two grown sons and four grandchildren. In addition to being an avid gardener, hiker, and birder, Tina heads up the Moore County Climate Crisis Working Group and has been actively involved with her Democratic Women's group.

Vickie Zangwill

Vickie is extremely involved in the Carteret County Democratic Party where she serves on as SEC member and as President of the Carteret Dem Women. Vickie is currently a member of the campaign staff for Katie Tomberlin for NC House District 13, as well as the chair of the Legislative Committee for DWNC. Originally from Staten Island, New York, Vickie is married with three sons and four grandsons. She owns several businesses in Cape Carteret and Jacksonville, NC, with her husband,

Margaret Villani

"Trained as a historian and educator, Ms. Villani's professional career path extended across multiple disciplines and industries, including accounting, IT, and insurance. She holds BS degrees in History and Information Systems. Her community service work has been dedicated to children's education, adult literacy, and healthcare reform. Since 2016, Ms. Villani has been devoted to researching Medicare for All and working toward its enactment. As her mother's primary care advocate from 2011 to 2018 Villani became aware of the injustices and inequities in our healthcare system. Her volunteer contributions to the people of North Carolina have been recognized by the State of North Carolina and the Greensboro Commission on the Status of Women.

Rebecca Cerese

Rebecca Cerese is a social justice activist, award-winning documentary filmmaker and a passionate healthcare advocate. She was the first ever Health Engagement Coordinator at the NC Justice Center, and is now their Health Policy Advocate. At the NC Justice Center she collects stories about people who are uninsured in order to push for policy changes. She is one of the founding members of the NC Medicare For All Coalition, board member of Health Care For All, NC, a steward for her union, UAW Local 2320, NOSLW, and the co-chair of the Health and Wellness Committee for the Chapel Hill/Carrboro NAACP.

Amy Chiou



She received her BA from the University of South Carolina - Columbia with a major in political science and a minor in Spanish and her JD from John Marshall Law School in Atlanta. Ms. Scott also attended Universidad del Sagrado Corazon in Santurce, Puerto Rico and The Fenix Institute in Zacatecas, Mexico. Scott has served as the Executive Director for the American Civil Liberties Union of South Carolina and as the South Carolina Deputy Political Director for Senator Kamala Harris 2020 Presidential Campaign. During the 2020 election cycle, she served as the Director of Voter Protection with the South Carolina Democratic Party.




CONVENTION MAP
